IATA EasyPay is a voluntary pay-as-you-go e-wallet solution for travel agents to issue tickets in the BSP

IATA EasyPay is a new voluntary, payment method which can be used in addition to the traditional BSP Cash and Card options. Based on an electronic wallet, this new payment option provides IATA-accredited agents with increased choice, flexibility and convenience.

IATA EasyPay will be globally available to all agents and offers the following benefits:



1. Access to new accreditation options

IATA EasyPay gives non-accredited agents a new route to accreditation through the GoLite model as it allows them to transact with airlines on a pay-as-you-go basis.

2. Option to reduce agents' financial security amounts with IATA

IATA EasyPay amounts are secured at the time of ticket issuance and can be used by agents to reduce their financial security with IATA. The more agents use IATA EasyPay, the lower the financial security amount required.

3. Added flexibility

IATA EasyPay provides agents with a new choice of payment method. Agents can fund their IATA EasyPay account with any of the funding options available in their market and can use the IATA EasyPay portal across multiple platforms.

4. Sales continuity

IATA EasyPay enables the introduction of the Remittance Holding Capacity (RHC) – a maximum threshold for Cash sales pending remittance via the BSP. It allows agents to continue to issue tickets in the BSP if their RHC has been reached.

5. Easy to use

IATA EasyPay is straightforward and easy for agents to use at the time of ticketing. In addition, the IATA EasyPay portal makes it easy for agents to manage and maintain their e-wallet.

Getting Started

To start using IATA EasyPay, agents simply need to create an IATA EasyPay account online via the IATA EasyPay portal. Once the account is created, agents can load funds into their e-wallet as they choose. Agents will then be able to generate single-use IEP numbers to enter in their GDS at the time of ticket issuance. If sufficient funds are available in the e-wallet, then the transaction will be authorized and the ticket issued. IATA EasyPay amounts will then be settled to the airlines via the BSP and reported on the agent billing reports as per usual.
